Ho-Chunk Clan Circle Dedication Ceremony at University of Wisconsin-Madison

On May 4, 2023, University of Wisconsin-Madison (UW-Madison) hosted a dedication ceremony for the Ho-Chunk Clan Circle sculptures located at the UW-Madison campus behind the new Bakke Recreation and Wellbeing Center and looking over Lake Mendota. The sculptures were created by Ho-Chunk artist Ken Representative Sarah Lemieux Lewis.

"The project started at the beginning of the pandemic," said Lewis. Ken estimates 48 versions

of the sculptures were done. The sculptures style is from vector art, computer graphic designs created directly from geometric shapes, lines, points, and curves.

Alliant Energy has provided the Ho-Chunk DNR's Forestry Division with money to purchase trees for transplant. Alliant asks that these trees are primarily planted in communities which they serve. This includes Tomah, Nekoosa, Wittenberg, Wisconsin Dells, Madison and some others. You can check at https://www.alliantenergy. com/aboutus/whoweare/ communitiesweserve to see if your community is included. We will adhere to this as much as possible, although we are allowed to make some small exceptions. Due to the short time

frame of this project we are limiting these trees to Ho-Chunk organizations. We would like to plant these trees

around public buildings or public spaces. Some examples (Not exclusively) would be Headstarts, TAUs, Community Centers, Health Centers, offices, parks. We could even plant along streets if an HCN

associated entity takes care of the right of way. We could plant in housing that is owned by tribal entities as well. The key being: whoever gets trees needs to water for two years! Continued on Page 3

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) reminds Wisconsin hunters that they have until May 31 to apply for a chance at a 2023 elk hunting license.

This year's elk hunting season will run from Saturday, Oct. 14 through Sunday, Nov. 12, as well as Thursday, Dec. 14 through Friday, Dec. 22. Successful applicants can hunt during either period.

Thanks to collaborative reintroduction efforts, Wisconsin's expanding elk population has had an annual hunt since 2018. The elk hunting season is a unique hunting opportunity, open only to Wisconsin residents. With a few clicks, Wisconsinites can purchase their elk license applications online through Go Wild. Application purchases are also available in-person at license agents across the state.

Applications are \$10 and are limited to one per person. The cost of an elk hunting license for the winners of the license drawing is \$49. The application fees directly support the management and research that sustain Wisconsin's elk herds, so all interested hunters are encouraged to apply.

The elk hunt drawing will occur in early June, and successful applicants will be notified shortly after. The department recommends all applicants check and update their contact information to ensure contact with successful applicants.

The department will approve the 2023 elk quota at the end of May. Consistent with past years, licenses will be issued for the Clam Lake Elk Range only.

Continued from Page 1 Quackenbush, and Ho-Chunk Chief Clayton Winneshiek.

Chief Winneshiek talked about the lands of the Midwestern United States belonging to the Ho-Chunk people. Chief Winneshiek hopes that the Ho-Chunk people will be here in the future and that the racist issues around the UW-Madison will be taken care.

Quackenbush talked about the history of Teejop (land known today as Madison, in Ho-Chunk meaning land of four lakes) and the Ho-Chunk connection with UW-Madison. Quackenbush hopes that communities will continue to have a mutual relationship with the Ho-Chunk Nation.

Then, UW-Madison Chancellor Jennifer Mnooken spoke. She echoed Chief Winneshiek's words on racial issues at UW-Madison. Chancellor Mnooken goals

for the Ho-Chunk Clan Circle are to create education for the wellness and reaction of all, honor the legacy of the Ho-Chunk Nation, work on a path with tribal leadership to further reduce cost of college education, and create stronger presence of Indigenous People on campus. Chancellor Mnooken was happy to show off her beaded Bucky Badger medallion gifted to her previously by Ho-Chunk. She thanked the Wisconsin Dells Singers for their songs, and ended her speech with a "Piniigigi."


The Wisconsin Dells Singers ended the ceremony with the Bear Clan song. The end of the ceremony was followed by food and beverages provided by Elaina Terry's Wild Bearies.

Ken Lewis said he is impressed to see the sculptures and proud and thankful to UW-Madison for making it happen for the Ho-Chunk Nation. Lewis hopes the sculptures bring better recognition for the Ho-Chunk People who have called the area home for generations, and that Ho-Chunk is more than just casinos and mascots, but actual people who live here.

Continued from Page 1 We have funding for about 90 trees, so we will have to spread the wealth as much as possible. We would hope that every HCN entity that requests trees could get at least two. We can increase that if we have fewer requests.

We will likely be getting these trees in early June. This can be a good time to plant a tree, but only if the entity getting the tree is committed to watering it 4 to 5 times a planted in September or later, when heat and dry conditions are less likely.

HCN is committed to delivering these trees to their planting locations. We would prefer that the recipients help plant. They can do it completely themselves, or with the help of our on-staff certified arborist. Resources as they are, we won't be able to do it all.

In deer heavy areas, tree protection will have to be installed by the time next winter rolls around. Ho Chunk DNR can help with this somewhat. However, tree protection is not part of the grant program, and we have limited amounts of materials. HCN DNR can help with advice on tree protection techniques in all cases and with materials, in some cases.

This will be an ongoing program. Next year we should be able to get more trees and include tribal members for their private residences.



Casino officials, Ho-Chunk Nation President, Marlon White-Eagle, and officials from Alliant Energy, Inertial Electric, and the Baraboo Area Chamber of Commerce were present for the event.

With collaborations from Alliant Energy and Inertial Electric, two ABB Terra 184 fast charging stations with 180 kilowatt DCFC dualport charging stations offer both a traditional charging option with pull-in parking as well as a pull-through station which allows easy charging for larger vehicles pulling trailers. Both charging stations are ADA compliant designed and available around the clock in the parking lot just 2 miles south of interstate 90/94, on exit 92.

"We are extremely excited about offering these EV stations for guests to the Wisconsin Dells and Baraboo areas," said Ho-Chunk Gaming Wisconsin Dells Executive Manager, Landon Owen.





Article XIII of the Constitution provides: "Section 2. Requests for a Secretarial Election. It shall be the duty of the Ho-Chunk Nation Election Board to call and hold an election on any proposed amendment to this Constitution at the request of two thirds (2/3) of the entire Legislature, at the request of the General Council, or upon presentation of a petition signed by thirty (30) percent of the eligible voters of the Ho-Chunk Nation."

"If a request for Secretarial Election made pursuant to Section 21.c also requests that such election be held in conjunction with a General Election, the full text of the proposed Amendment will be placed on the Official Ballot of the General Election, an indication of the Amendment number, as well as an option for Eligible Voters to vote in favor of, or against, the Amendment. The Election Board can apply the process set forth in Section 21.f for the counting of ballots and results." Code 2 HCC Sec. 6.21.e(3)(a).

Pursuant to Legislative Resolution 03-07-23A, the Legislature has requested the Election Board have a Secretarial Election, and that it be held in conjunction with the General Election on June 6, 2023. The Proposed Amendment is as follows:

Amendment One:

ARTICLE IV- GENERAL COUNCIL

Section 3. Powers Retained by the General Council

"(g) General Council Branch delegates authority to General Council Agency to selection, hire, manage and supervise General Council Branch personnel to accomplish the tasks mandated by General Council."

Voters will be asked a Yes or No question. A "yes" vote will be in favor of the amendment removing the section of the Constitution. A "no" vote will be against the amendment, and to leave the Constitution unchanged.

DUDGUANT TO ADTICLE VIII SEC 1

If a person cannot write, that person must sign his/her name with a mark before two (2) witnesses. A Ho-Chunk translator will be available to assist any tribal member who requests assistance.

ELIGIBILITY DISPUTES:

Any individual whose name does not appear on the eligible voters list can claim the right to vote by presenting a written challenge to the Election Board. Any eligible voter may challenge the eligibility of an individual's name appearing on the eligible voters list by presenting a written challenge to the Election Board.

The Election Board shall rule on all written challenges to the list of eligible voters immediately after the close of the challenge period. Section 11. c. ii. (Deadline, Thursday, May 18, 2023).

Absentee Ballots must be received before 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday, June 6, 2023. Absentee ballots may be returned by overnight mail, so they may be received at the Election Board Office or the polling places prior to the Election Day. **NOTE** THAT FEDEX and UPS NEXT

There shall be no electioneering within fifty (50) feet of any polling places.
