The House of Wellness hosted a winter basketball camp on March 25 and 26 for boys and girls ages 10-17 featuring Bronson Koenig and area coaches. The registration was free due to a grant from the Green Bay Packers Foundation. Approximately fifty participants received a free t-shirt.

“It was great we all had a lot of fun, the kids, the coaches, and to everybody. I asked the kids if we should do something like this again and it was a resounding yes,” said Koenig, the UW great and NCAA Final Four player.

Boys and girls in grades fourth through sixth were scheduled for 1:00 pm until 2:30 pm. Those in grades

seventh through eighth were scheduled for 3:00 pm until 4:30 pm. High school-aged boys and girls were scheduled for 5:00 pm until 6:30 pm. There were also daily awards for attendees.

Bronson Koenig explained what he wanted the boys and girls to take away from the camp, “First of all, I like to see the kids having fun, outside of their day to day lives. Just to do something a little different and obviously give them some of my experience, some of my life experience through basketball. And also teach them what it takes to succeed in anything in life, the hard work that it takes, not just in basketball but that translates into literally anything you want to do in

life. You know, lots of up and downs, like the game. There are so many translations and metaphors between basketball and life that I try to teach as well. It’s just about putting your head down and working as hard as you can and working through the hard times. There are going to be a lot of those in the game and also life.”

The two-day camp was open to the public and camaraderie filled the gym.

“I’m super thankful that they (Green Bay Packers Foundation) do this work to help communities, especially the Ho-Chunk Nation. I’m really thankful for them. Hopefully we continue to build that relationship,” expressed Koenig.

No May 2023 Per Capita Distribution

The Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature passed Resolution 04-04-23 B by an affirmative vote of 10 members, two opposed, and zero abstaining. This resolution states, "in light of the unprecedented circumstances, and pursuant to its Constitutional authority, and the Per Capita Distribution Ordinance, does hereby declare that no per capita distribution will be made to the 7,766 eligible tribal members on May 1, 2023."

The Per Capita Distribution Ordinance provides for the per capita distribution of revenues appropriated by the Legislature from gaming revenues. The Ho-Chunk Nation President Marlon White Eagle issued 'Administrative Order March 17, 2020-1,' which

closed the Nation's casinos to the public, effective no later than March 20, 2020, due to the public health emergency. The Nation's gaming facilities re-opened on June 29, 2020.

The current resolution states that "the Legislature finds that the declaration of per capita distribution for May 1, 2023 is impacted as a result of the closure of the Nation's gaming operations and the Nation's continued recovery from the impacts of the pandemic on the Nation's gaming revenues."

The general welfare assistance runs from July 2022 through June 2023. The budget contains funds to provide \$800 to adult tribal members each month and \$400 to children tribal members each quarter.

2023 Ojibwe Spring Fishing Season Starting Soon Wisconsinites Reminded Of Protected Tribal Right To Fish

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) reminds Wisconsinites of the protected tribal right to fish in certain Wisconsin waterways and the legal consequences they could face if found interfering with that right during the upcoming Ojibwe spring fishing season.

"The Wisconsin DNR fully supports Ojibwe sovereignty and treaty rights," said DNR Secretary Adam N. Payne. "We encourage tribal members to get out and exercise their treaty rights. Likewise, we remind the public that it is illegal to interfere with this right and have zero tolerance for harassment."

Each tribal fishing season, tribal members harvest using various high-efficiency meth-

ods, including spearing and netting. The DNR collaborates with the Ojibwe tribes to uphold these tribal rights.

"It's against the law to interfere with tribal members' right to hunt, fish, and gather within the Ceded Territories," said Attorney General Kaul. "I join DNR Secretary Payne in calling for a peaceful and respectful spring tribal harvest season in Wisconsin."

Part of the collaboration between the DNR and the Ojibwe tribes includes working together to set a safe harvest limit for every walleye and muskellunge lake in the Ceded Territory. These safe harvest limits ensure that the walleye and muskellunge harvests do not adversely affect each lake's fishery.

The spring tribal fish har-

vest usually begins in mid- to late-April and runs through May, or shortly after the ice melts. The season typically starts in the southern portion of the Ceded Territory and moves north as the season progresses. The tribal harvest is not a date-regulated activity, and as a result, there is neither an open nor closed season.

There are 2,300 lakes larger than 25 acres in the Ceded Territory, including 919 walleye lakes and 623 musky lakes. Each year, the Ojibwe tribal members fish a portion of these lakes outside of reservation boundaries during their spring harvest season. Tribal members rely on these lakes to preserve their cultural heritage and also act as a vital

Agriculture Division



No Bull. According to the Ho-Chunk Nation's Community Economic Development Strategy plan (CEDs), Agriculture ranks number 8 on the scale tribal members want to see developed. This means the Nation can actualize a few directions in which to proceed. The Division will restart Whirling Thunder as its new HQ.

The Division of Agriculture announces its first EQIP GRANT through USDA NRCS Program. The grant will provide a grazing plan, three (3) high tunnels (greenhouses) and contour strips to prevent erosion.

Division of Agriculture attended the Grassworks conference at Chula Vista in Dells. The conference promoted three main areas including grazing, soil health, and fencing. Bringing our farms back up to code will be the next big challenge using a Regenerative Agriculture methods. Lastly, HCN should look at experimenting with Kernza and Big Blue Stem as perennials.

The Driftless Conference otherwise known as the Grassland 2.0 project featured new voices deciding the future of the Driftless area. People have come together to look at how the Ho-Chunk Nation can come into the fold to help decide the future fate of the Driftless, especially with farming. This is another one step forward to empower the Nation's Agricultural activities in the region.

Winona LaDuke headlined a star studded gala that featured American Indian Farmers across the Midwest taking up various spaces in the Ag industry. LaDuke described how HEMP and CDB are ruled by the female plants and how they are the back bone of our new economies. Ho-Chunk Nation is strategically in a great spot if it were to move forward to those markets. Wisconsin once had 11 hemp productions plants before being made illegal.

The Marbleseed conference in La Crosse featured many types of organic and regenerative farm concepts to consider. Some of the ideas seemed to look at the overall nutritious value of food and how more Ho-Chungra should eat quality food being produced in better grow conditions. This is an essential step to our food security problem.

Soon the DNR Division of Agriculture will become the HCN Department of Agriculture come July 2023. This is a historic moment for the Ho-Chunk Nation. Since General Council voted for a Department of Agriculture to be started 2015, the division was added to DNR budget. The Department is eager to get started with all its projects. 


To whom it may concern,

 food source for their communities.

By March 15 of every year, each tribe declares how many walleyes and muskellunge it intends to harvest from each lake based on the safe harvest limits. Harvest begins shortly after the ice melts, with nightly fishing permits issued by the tribes to their members to harvest a specific number of fish, including one walleye between 20 and 24 inches and one additional walleye of any size.

All fish that are taken are documented each night by a tribal clerk or warden who are present at boat landings. Once the declared harvest is reached in a given lake, no additional permits are issued for that lake, and the harvest ends. The Great Lakes Indian Fish & Wildlife Commission (GLIFWC) provides daily reports to the DNR for all fish harvested off-reservation by spearing or netting in the Ceded Territory.

TRIBAL RIGHTS

In the mid-1800s, the Lake Superior Ojibwe Tribes ceded more than 22,000 square

miles of tribal territory across Northern Wisconsin, including all or parts of 30 counties through a series of treaties with the United States federal government.

When the Ojibwe ceded lands to the federal government, they maintained their rights to hunt, fish and gather off reservation land within the Ceded Territory. However, after Wisconsin became a state, state and local officials frequently assumed statehood superseded Ojibwe treaty rights and regulated or prohibited off-reservation hunting, fishing, and gathering by tribal members.

In 1983, a federal court ruling reaffirmed the Ojibwe had the right to hunt, fish and gather off-reservation in the Ceded Territory, including the right to catch fish by spearing and netting.

INTERFERING WITH TRIBAL RIGHTS

It is illegal to interfere or attempt to interfere with tribal members who are exercising treaty rights, including the spring harvest of walleye. Prohibited conduct against any tribal member includes,

but is not limited to, stalking, obstructing access to lakes, recklessly operating watercraft, creating hazardous wakes, threatening violence and committing acts of violence.

The Ojibwe spring harvest, which includes spearfishing, is an integral and respected part of Wisconsin's history. The DNR is actively engaged with tribal law enforcement officers to protect tribal rights not only for the upcoming season but for generations to come and will continue to work to ensure all who participate are able to have a safe and enjoyable experience.

These treaties and court decisions remain in place today, ensuring the Ojibwe can continue to exercise their right to hunt, fish and gather off-reservation in the Ceded Territories. To assist in regulating those activities, 11 Ojibwe bands have formed GLIFWC, which provides fully trained wardens who patrol the Ceded Territory to make sure tribal members are following appli-

cable tribal conservation laws. Violations are cited into tribal courts for prosecution. Ojibwe spearing and netting are carefully monitored and regulated by staff from both GLIFWC and the Wisconsin DNR.

Anyone violating tribal rights could be charged under several Wisconsin laws, fined up to \$10,000 and sentenced up to 9 months in prison. Additionally, any tribal member whose rights are violated may bring civil action for damages and seek a restraining order.

WISCONSIN'S HATE CRIME PROVISIONS

Wisconsin law includes hate crime penalty enhancements for many crimes if they are committed, at least in part, based on a "belief or perception regarding the race, religion, color, disability, sexual orientation, national origin or ancestry of" the victim. For example, when a hate crime penalty enhancement applies to a felony, the maximum fine can be increased by up to an additional \$5,000 and the maximum prison term can be

increased by up to an additional 5 years.

REPORTING TRIBAL RIGHTS INFRINGEMENT

If you have witnessed or been subject to infringement of tribal rights to hunt, fish and gather that is active and involves physical harassment or a verbal threat of physical harm, report that to local law enforcement immediately by calling 911.

If the threat has passed, please contact local law enforcement at the non-emergency number. Call or text the confidential DNR Tip Hotline at 1-800-TIP-WDNR, as soon as possible to make a report of the event.

The Great Lakes Indian Fish & Wildlife Commission (GLIFWC) also recommends reporting any instances of infringement in order to maintain a record and provide appropriate follow up. Call GLIFWC Enforcement at 715-685-2113 to document an incident.

SECRETARIAL ELECTION

Article XIII of the Constitution provides: “Section 1. Requirements. This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the qualified voters of the Ho-Chunk Nation voting at an election called for that purpose by the Ho-Chunk Nation Election Board, provided, that at least thirty (30) percent of those entitled to vote shall vote in such election.

Article XIII of the Constitution provides: “Section 2. Requests for a Secretarial Election. It shall be the duty of the Ho-Chunk Nation Election Board to call and hold an election on any proposed amendment to this Constitution at the request of two thirds (2/3) of the entire Legislature, at the request of the General Council, or upon presentation of a petition signed by thirty (30) percent of the eligible voters of the Ho-Chunk Nation.”

“If a request for Secretarial Election made pursuant to Section 21.c also requests that such election be held in conjunction with a General Election, the full text of the proposed Amendment will be placed on the Official Ballot of the General Election, an indication of the Amendment number, as well as an option for Eligible Voters to vote in favor of, or against, the Amendment. The Election Board can apply the process set forth in Section 21.f for the counting of ballots and results.” Code 2 HCC Sec. 6.21.c(3)(a).

Pursuant to Legislative Resolution 03-07-23A, the Legislature has requested the Election Board have a Secretarial Election, and that it be held in conjunction with the General Election on June 6, 2023. The Proposed Amendment is as follows:

Amendment One:

ARTICLE IV- GENERAL COUNCIL

Section 3. Powers Retained by the General Council

“(g) General Council Branch delegates authority to General Council Agency to selection, hire, manage and supervise General Council Branch personnel to accomplish the tasks mandated by General Council.”

Voters will be asked a Yes or No question. A “yes” vote will be in favor of the amendment removing the section of the Constitution. A “no” vote will be against the amendment, and to leave the Constitution unchanged.

PURSUANT TO ARTICLE XIII SEC 1 AND ELECTION CODE SECTION 3.bb, THIRTY PERCENT (30%) OF ELIGIBLE VOTERS MUST CAST A VOTE EITHER FOR OR AGAINST THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS FOR THE AMENDMENT TO BE VALID. IF LESS THAN 30% OF ELIGIBLE VOTERS PARTICIPATE, THE AMENDMENT SHALL BE DEEMED TO NOT PASS.

ELIGIBLE VOTERS:

Any enrolled member of the Ho-Chunk Nation who is at least eighteen (18) years old and who has resided in their respective district for at least three (3) months. See Election Code Sec. 11 (a) (6).

REGISTRATION:

Each person seeking to vote must register at the polling place by showing identification before receiving an Official Ballot.

If a person cannot write, that person must sign his/her name with a mark before two (2) witnesses. A Ho-Chunk translator will be available to assist any tribal member who requests assistance.

ELIGIBILITY DISPUTES:

Any individual whose name does not appear on the eligible voters list can claim the right to vote by presenting a written challenge to the Election Board. Any eligible voter may challenge the eligibility of an individual’s name appearing on the eligible voters list by presenting a written challenge to the Election Board.

The Election Board shall rule on all written challenges to the list of eligible voters immediately after the close of the challenge period. Section 11. c. ii. (Deadline, Thursday, May 18, 2023).

A voter may vote by absentee ballot provided the Election Board receives the absentee ballot request in writing no later than Saturday, May 27, 2023, by 4:00 P.M. See Election Code, Page 26, Sec. 13 (a) (i).

Requests MUST INCLUDE the eligible voter’s name printed or typed (with signature), physical address where the ballot will be delivered (we use UPS next Day Air – UPS Next Day Air will not deliver to a P.O. Box), daytime telephone number and enrollment number.

Please check eligible voter’s lists for your Districts.

Absentee Ballots must be received before 7:00 P.M. on **Tuesday, June 6, 2023**. Absentee ballots may be returned by overnight mail, so they may be received at the Election Board Office or the polling places prior to the Election Day. **NOTE THAT FEDEX and UPS NEXT DAY AIR DOES NOT DELIVER IN BLACK RIVER FALLS ON SATURDAYS.**

POSTING ELECTION RESULTS:

The Election Board shall certify and post the official election results within three (3) days after the date of election.

CONTESTING OF ELECTION RESULTS:

Any member of the Ho-Chunk Nation may challenge the results of any election results within ten (10) days after the Election Board certifies the results. The Trial Court shall hear and decide a challenge to any election within twenty (20) days after the challenge is filed in the Trial Court.

ELECTIONEERING:

There shall be no electioneering within fifty (50) feet of any polling places.
